

# **Accomplishments**

Learn, Share, Lead. 2019 was an opportunity to truly put the MWL Education Fund's motto into practice as we hosted events across the state to connect Mainers with education and information about the policies and systems that shape our lives. Continuing our effort to be more accessible, we went out to meet the community where they were, from the Common Ground Fair in Unity to the Women's March in Portland and everywhere in between! During 2019, our volunteer list grew by 280 members, making it easier than ever for our community to find opportunities to get involved.

For the 23rd year, 99 girls representing every county in Maine joined us for Girls' Day at the Statehouse for a day of mock hearings, discussions with female leaders, and debate on the floor of the House - with the help of over 30 volunteer mentors, lobbyists, and legislators. This was the first year that girls had a chance to take selfies with Maine's first female governor. One participant clearly articulated what we want for all members of our community: "Today I learned that my voice matters and I mean something."

The legendary civil rights activist Tarana Burke, founder of #MeToo,



joined Maine leaders and over 200 participants for #MaineToo: Summit on Women's Economic Security, which highlighted the intersections of sexual violence and harassment and women's economic security. It was also an opportunity to center the voices and experiences of women from marginalized communities in Maine, and to acknowledge the disproportionate impacts of both sexual violence and economic injustice on those communities. One participant shared that, "Bearing witness to Tarana Burke's speech exceeded my already high expectations. As a survivor those moments will stay with me for years to come."



# **Accomplishments**

From health and safety to economic and reproductive justice, the Maine Women's Lobby focused on a range of solutions-oriented legislation this session. At the center of this effort, we led the Maine Paid Leave Coalition in an effort to establish a system of paid family and medical leave in Maine (LD 1410, Sponsor: Speaker Gideon). This bill advanced to a hearing and work session and was carried over to the 2020 session. In addition to our coalition work on paid leave, a few of the bills we are most proud to have worked on include:

### **Health and Wellness:**

Ensuring that MaineCare and private insurance providers cover abortion care whenever prenatal care coverage is also available. This is a major victory that ensures more equity in abortion care access. (LD 820, Sponsor: Rep. McCreight)

Ensuring that Advanced Practice Clinicians such as nurse midwives and physician assistants can provide abortion care, in keeping with their training. (LD 1261, Sponsor: Speaker Gideon)

Allowing non-prescription drugs, such as Plan B and ibuprofen, to be available in vending machines. This is an important support for students, rural Mainers, and anyone who might

struggle to access certain care in their region. (LD 37, Sponsor: Rep. Terry)

Establishing a ban on conversion therapy for minors, a dangerous practice which harms LGBTQ+ youth. We were proud to work with a range of partners including EqualityMaine, ACLU Maine, and GLAAD. (LD 1025, Sponsor: Rep. Fecteau)

# Freedom from Discrimination and Economic Justice:

Establishing a requirement that employers with more than 10 employees ensure that employees can earn paid leave time - one hour of paid time for every 40 hours worked, up to 40 hours per year (there are some exemptions, and we continue to advocate for a full system of paid family and medical leave). (LD 369, Sponsor: Sen. Millett)

Creating a critical protection for pregnant people in any occupation to be able to access reasonable accommodations in their work. (LD 666, Sponsor: Rep. Carney)

Ensuring that employers cannot ask about a potential employee's prior wage history, and classifies mandatory disclosure of wage history as discrimination under the Maine Human Rights Act. This helps protect

women, people of color, and other historically under-valued workers from future wage discrimination. (LD 278, Sponsor: Sen. Breen)

Establishing a permanent commission focused on creating equity and opportunity for racial, indigenous, and Maine Tribal populations in our state. We supported the Coalition on Racial Equity in this success. (LD 777, Sponsor: Rep. Talbot Ross)

### **Freedom from Violence:**

Extending the statute of limitations for certain sex crimes from 8 years to 20 years for victims 16 and older (many sex crimes against children under 16 already have no statute of limitations). We were proud to support the Maine Coalition Against Sexual Assault on this bill. (LD 67, Sponsor: Sen. Herbig)

Created a definition of economic abuse in the law and provides a way for the court to order compensation for losses resulting from economic abuse. We congratulate the Maine Coalition to End Domestic Violence for leading this effort. (LD 748, Sponsor: Rep. Fay)
