WELCOME

The first session of the 129th Maine Legislature adjourned in the early hours of June 20th. We witnessed tremendous legislative victories that will improve the lives of Maine women, families, and people whose voices are often disregarded in public policy decisions. While we analyzed, provided testimony, and lobbied on over 60 bills, we have chosen to highlight a few key priorities for the purpose of this report.

Despite these momentous victories, we still have a lot of work to do. LD 1410, Speaker Gideon's proposal for a comprehensive paid family and medical leave policy, was carried over until the short session in January. This is one of the Maine Women's Lobby's top priorities, and we are honored to chair the Maine Paid Leave Coalition. We continue working tirelessly with our coalition partners and other stakeholders to strengthen the bill and highlight the dire need for this benefit in Maine.

Although Rep. Lois Reckitt's Maine Equal Rights Amendment did not reach the 101 votes needed in the House, the fight isn't over. We will continue to work across the aisle to achieve the goal of true gender equity in Maine and get the ERA on the statewide ballot.

We worked on a number of legal justice system reform bills, including Rep. Rachel Talbot Ross's LD 1422, which will address conditions of incarcerated women and trans/nonbinary folks in our state and county correctional facilities. This bill was carried over, and we will keep fighting for our most vulnerable residents by bringing their voices and perspectives into policy discussions in Augusta.

Many urgent priorities like early childhood education and child care and Medicaid-funded dental care remain unfunded. A bill that bans non-disclosure agreements in hiring practices remains unsigned. We cannot envision a future free from violence and discrimination, with full access to economic justice, without these basic needs met for all Maine residents. Beyond that, our goal should not end at basic needs: all Mainers deserve to thrive and flourish. We remain tirelessly committed to shifting institutional power into the hands of our communities and guaranteeing that your voices are heard when decisions are being made.

When the legislature is called back in January, we'll be there. When policies are being crafted and decisions are being made in the halls of power, you can count on us to be there to make sure your voices are heard loud and clear.

We lobbied on a number of bills this legislative session, ranging from abortion access and enhanced justice for sexual assault survivors to workers' rights and pay equity. Some of those went "under the hammer" without a roll call, and others were met with lengthy, passionate debate. We worked on a lot of bills, and though we would love to include them all here, we took just a snapshot for this report. HEALTH CARE

LD 820, An Act to Prevent Discrimination in Public and Private Insurance Coverage for Pregnant Women in Maine

Sponsor: Representative Joyce "Jay" McCreight

This bill requires public (MaineCare) and private insurance coverage of abortion care when prenatal care coverage is also available. A tremendous victory for health care in Maine, LD 820 creates more equity in the delivery of abortion services, especially among low income individuals, people living in rural areas, and people of color.

House roll call #246: Passed to be enacted (MWL supported); Prevails
Senate roll call #294: Passed to be enacted in concurrence (MWL supported); Prevails

LD 1261, An Act to Authorize Certain Health Care Professionals to Perform Abortions

Sponsor: Speaker Sara Gideon (Governor's bill)

LD 1261 sought to rectify an over thirty year ban on Advanced Practice Clinicians (APCs), such as nurse midwives and physician assistants, providing abortion care. Fully trained to deliver this care, the authorization of APCs to perform abortions is critical to Mainers who wish and deserve to receive high quality care from their trusted medical providers in the communities where they live (many of which are rural).

MWL position: *Support* **Final status:** *Became law with Governor's signature*

LD 37, An Act to Allow for the Sale of Nonprescription Drugs through Vending Machines

Sponsor: Representative Maureen “Mo” Terry

Brought forward by a University of Southern Maine student, LD 37 was an effort to increase access to nonprescription drugs, such as ibuprofen or the morning after pill, for individuals living on college campuses with limited health services hours or folks living in rural areas where access is a challenge. The bill allows for any nonprescription drug to be dispensed through a vending machine. After an extended delay in the IDEA committee, the proposal ultimately prevailed.

DISCRIMINATION/WORKERS' RIGHTS



LD 369, An Act to Support Healthy Workplaces and Healthy Families by Providing Earned Paid Sick Leave to Certain Employees

Sponsor: Senator Rebecca Millett

LD 369 sought to guarantee a worker's right to earn short-term time off to care for themselves or a loved one when ill. The bill went through several negotiation processes and amendments until consensus was ultimately found, transforming LD 369 into a “paid time off” bill. Several provisions, such as municipal preemption and lack of clearly defined enforcement language, were not

supported by MWL however. Maine Women's Lobby is actively involved in the rule-making process with our partners to ensure that enforcement of the law is adequate and a grievance process through the Maine Department of Labor is clear and available to workers. This law is effective January 1, 2021.

LD 666, An Act to Protect Pregnant Workers

Sponsor: Representative Anne Carney

LD 666 ensures reasonable accommodations to pregnant workers, a critical protection for pregnant people in any occupation, from jobs involving manual labor to those in an office setting. MWL is still lobbying for the passage of the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act at the federal level--regardless, we are extremely pleased that these protections are now guaranteed in Maine.

LD 1025, An Act to Prohibit the Provision of Conversion Therapy to Minors by Certain Licensed Professionals

Sponsor: House Assistant Majority Leader Ryan Fecteau

Passed in the 128th legislature and vetoed by Governor Paul LePage, LD 1025 prohibits certain licensed professionals in Maine from providing the pseudoscientific practice of “conversion therapy” to minors, a dangerous and widely discredited practice that significantly harms LGBTQ+ youth. We proudly worked on LD 1025 from start to finish with our colleagues at EqualityMaine, ACLU Maine, and GLBTQ Legal Advocates & Defenders.

LD 777, An Act To Establish the Permanent Commission on the Status of Racial, Indigenous and Maine Tribal Populations

Sponsor: Representative Rachel Talbot Ross

This bill establishes a permanent commission charged with promoting, carrying out, and coordinating programs that enhance and create opportunity for racial, Indigenous, and Maine Tribal populations in Maine. Stakeholders represent a variety of interests, including individuals who work in higher education, business, community development, and individuals who belong to historically and structurally marginalized communities. LD 777 was the priority bill for the Coalition on Racial Equity (CORE), a legislative work group committed to ensuring racial equity and justice through policy in Maine.

MWL position: *Support* **Final status:** *Signed into law with Governor's signature*

SAFETY FROM VIOLENCE

LD 67, An Act to Ensure Access to Justice for Victims of Sexual Assault

Sponsor: Senator Erin Herbig

A priority bill of our partners at the Maine Coalition Against Sexual Assault (MECASA), LD 67 extends the statute of limitations for victims over 16 for classes A, B, and C Gross Sexual Assaults and Unlawful Sexual Contacts from 8 to 20 years.

MWL Position: *Support* **Final status:** *Signed into law with Governor's signature*
No roll calls - Unanimous support in both bodies.

LD 748, An Act to Provide Relief to Survivors of Economic Abuse

Sponsor: Representative Jessica Fay

A priority bill of our partners at the Maine Coalition to End Domestic Violence, LD 748 defines economic abuse in statute and provides for the court to order compensation for losses resulting from the economic abuse. The bill also provides for an economic abuse survivor to be protected from debt collection and for the economic abuse survivor's credit to be repaired.

MWL position: *Support* **Final status:** *Signed into law with Governor's signature*
No roll call - Unanimous support in both bodies.

ECONOMIC SECURITY

LD 278, An Act Regarding Pay Equality

Sponsor: Senator Cathy Breen

LD 278 prohibits employers from seeking information about a prospective employee's prior wage history before an offer of employment; this includes all compensation. The bill classifies required disclosure of information about prior wage history as discrimination under the Maine Human Rights Act.

MWL Position: Support **Final status:** Signed into law with Governor's signature

LD 1317, An Act To Restore Services To Help Certain Noncitizens Meet Their Basic Needs

Sponsor: Representative Drew Gattine

LD 1317 sought to restore access to critical assistance to people seeking asylum and certain other immigrants seeking safety and security here--access to these services had broad bipartisan support prior to the LePage administration. Unfortunately, the Senate did not take action on this bill to support new immigrant Mainers.

MWL Position: Support **Final Status:** Died in Senate
